Hub Sites are where:

- Radio communications occur among Hub Sites and, hopefully, with the City,
- Problem/Status Report forms are brought,
- Resources are allocated to needs, and
- You can volunteer skills and equipment

ARE YOU PREPARED?

Personally Prepared

- What do you need to survive?
- Where should it be located?
- What if you can't re-enter your building?
- Do you know how to turn off your utilities?
- How do you contact your family / inner circle?
- Do you have a plan for employees?

Connect with Neighbors

- Do you know each other?
- Do you have especially vulnerable neighbors?
- Are your neighbors prepared?
- How can you help one another?

There is no substitute for being prepared beforehand.

HOW YOU CAN HELP YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

- Personally prepare in advance,
- Connect with your neighbors to plan how you will mutually assist one another,
- Share this brochure with neighbors, and
- Learn how to volunteer and/or be a resource.

- Cause extensive damage and injuries,
- Close businesses, and
- Create food and supply shortages.
